In the fall of 2009, Jason Moore and Deb Heine started discussing the possibility of commissioning a piece of music for the Canon Ringers. Deb Heine was asked to select a composer suitable for this project and immediately responded with the name John Behnke. Dr. Behnke is a nationally known, published composer who is known to our bell choir, as well as a friend of the Heine family. On behalf of the music staff, Deb contacted John and asked if he could fit this project into his schedule which he happily agreed to do.

A short time later, Deb was diagnosed with cancer and this project was, understandably, put on the back burner. Sadly, cancer took Deb from us late last summer. After her passing, Jason contacted Rick Heine and asked for permission to resume the project, now in memory of Deb. With Rick's gracious permission, we have pursued that new work and in late January, the Canon Ringers began rehearsing "Deb's Song" by Dr. John Behnke.

On Sunday, May 22, at the 9:00am and 10:45am worship services, we will premier "Deb's Song." As you will learn in May, this piece, literally, has Deb's name all over it. The primary theme of the work is based on the pitches D, E and B. The work is divided into 12 short sections, each depicting an event in Deb's life from childhood through marriage and family to her diagnosis and struggle with cancer.

This is a very powerful piece of music that is the perfect tribute to Deb. When you arrive on Sunday, May 22 for worship, with your bulletin you will receive an insert that depicts specific sections of the music and describes how the composition changes at each new section to help you follow along during this anthem.

Please join us in worship on May 22 as we celebrate God's gift of music and remember our dear friend, Deb Heine.

A Flying Solo Moment

On March 23, Flying Solo was privileged to have Jay Lieberson speak. Jay is an attorney in Yardley specializing in divorce mediation. In addition, he kindly stayed until all of the questions regarding divorce were answered.

Divorce mediation was introduced in the 1970's. There were several reasons that it was developed as an alternative to the traditional divorce process. Jay feels that the most important one is due to the emotional toll on the people involved, tearing families apart. Mediation is not an adversarial process. It is much less expensive, allowing for the use of one attorney. Jay advises his clients to have their own attorneys look over the agreement and about 40% do. The process is more personal and the time is better spent. It is also a custom fit and not off the rack, as Jay describes it. In court, there are as many as 8 cases being heard on one day. Your case is one among many. All issues are decided upon in mediation, such as custody, support and property.

Individuals involved in mediation feel more empowered as each person's input helps to mold the result, according to Jay. In this way, people can get what they want and need, including the children. For example, work schedules can be taken into account to reduce the need for outside childcare. In a Masters Hearing, the Judge takes the information provided and makes a decision. Mediation is a voluntary process. Jay describes 80% of his cases as being successful. He tries many strategies before telling a couple that he is unable to help them through mediation and that they require the traditional route. He focuses on what is needed to come to an agreement. If his clients are focusing on why their marriage got to this point, he recommends a therapist. Jay does not represent either person and never talks to one without the other.

Partnership

Presbyterians Helping Presbyterians Globally NPC - Zambia Connection – A Growing Partnership

Although there have been Presbyterian roots in Zambia that date back to the 1860's and the mission work done by the Church of Scotland, it was just three years ago that the Presbytery of Philadelphia first proposed to formalize a partnership with two Presbyterian Synods in Zambia.

As part of that growing relationship, we were fortunate to have six members of our congregation visit Zambia with a delegation from our Presbytery last summer. Our NPC team appreciated the moral and financial support from the congregation that made that trip possible. It was life-changing for those that went. They were so impressed with everyone they met - the enthusiasm, energy and the devotion to God's work. They were warmly welcomed into their congregations and into their homes. They say that some of their fondest memories were staying in the local homes.

The Presbyterian Church there is growing so fast that they do not have enough ministers to tend to all the congregations that are springing up. They are very industrious, and even though they are working with limited funds, virtually every church has an elementary school with a lunch program. Their calendars are full of events and services for their active communities. The women's groups are especially active, as they are here, taking care of those in need.

It is our intention, as part of furthering our growing relationship, to sponsor two representatives from Zambia. What they need is help with transportation. Airline tickets will be \$2000 each for a total of \$4000. There will also be an opportunity for us to return the warm reception that our members received and to host our Zambian guests.



